Uniform Updates

End of Term Plans

I am pleased to be able to offer our students with a day of fun activities on Thursday 20th July. Final details of our Alton Towers and onsite Fun Day will be communicated with students and parents/carers in the coming days, and we are incredibly excited to celebrate with all students



on this day. We will also be holding a number of Reward Assemblies throughout the week where students will receive several exciting and fun awards.

On Friday 21st July, our last school day of the year, we have decided to give students a nonuniform day as an additional reward! We will also be **giving away two laptops** in a draw which will include all students who attend school every day during the last week of term. On Friday, students will leave the Academy early at 12.35. The Farndon 683 bus has been rescheduled and will leave at 12.45. The Stagecoach community buses cannot be rescheduled, so students who use No. 2 Winthorpe will need to catch the Stagecoach service 3 outside Lidl and transfer to service 2 at the bus station. Students who use the 686 Barnby in the Willows service will be required to make alternative travel arrangements. September Return

All students will return to the Academy on Monday 4th September following three days of staff inset/preparation. Our new Headteacher, Miss Inma Pena is very excited to be joining our Academy and to welcoming all students back to school.

On the 4th all students will go straight to their Crew Leaders classrooms where they will be registered. There will be a number of key activities to support students return prior to moving into the first lessons of the year. Parents/Carers will receive specific information, via email nearer the time, as to which Crew Leader and classroom your child/children will need to go to. A reminder our Academy day commences at 8.25am and all students must be through the bottom pedestrian gate before this time.

All new year 7 children will be required to bring a packed lunch to the Academy across the first week whilst we set-up their cashless Squid accounts. Those children who are eligible for free school meals will be provided for from 4th September and will not be required to bring a packed lunch with them.
