

Excellence at Newark Academy

On Thursday this week, two Royal Navy Chefs visited Newark Academy to deliver an interactive masterclass to our talented Y10 Hospitality and Catering students. The challenge was set high with students being placed into groups – "Ready Steady Cook" style. They had 90 minutes to create Herby Chicken Kievs with Fondant Potatoes and Mini Pavlovas with Fresh Berries, Chantilly Cream and Coulis. The students rose to the challenge and worked amazingly in their teams, delegating and negotiating responsibilities to complete beautifully presented and highly skilled dishes.

Personal Development Programme

In our assemblies this week, we spoke to the students about the importance of feedback and metacognition. We explained to the children the different ways teachers feedback, and assess, their learning, and asked them to consider how they receive and respond to feedback when it is given. We unpicked how our mindset influences our learning and that a positive mindset enables us to take those next steps to improve. Metacognition involves understanding as learners what our strengths are, the areas we need to develop but also knowing what we now need to do next time.

As part of the Crew programme this week, students have continued to learn about Digital Literacy and Media Influence, which has primarily focused on how to stay safe online, understanding sources and their credibility and how to use social media effectively.
