In full crew assemblies this week, Heads of Crew have delivered excellent presentations on peer to peer abuse focusing on the importance of respecting personal space, staying safe online and sexual harassment. At Newark Academy, we are very lucky to have anti-bullying ambassadors who work together alongside staff to raise awareness and offer support to combat bullying. Anti-bullying ambassadors help educate their peers on bullying, lead on anti-bullying campaigns and promote a culture which celebrates and tolerates difference.

We continue to be very saddened by the devastating suffering of all parties involved in the Gaza - Israeli conflict. On Tuesday next week, during Crew we will share with our students a presentation that explains the factual and historical context behind this conflict. This will NOT be a pro-Israeli or pro-Palestinian presentation, but a presentation based on factual historical knowledge that will help students understand why the current events are happening.



Over the last two weeks our older students have been able to take part in the following two trips. The students were a credit to the school, their families and themselves.

Silver Duke of Edinburgh

Sixteen students embarked on a three-day expedition to qualify for their Silver Duke of Edinburgh Award. All students navigated their way around the Derbyshire countryside walking and climbing a distance of 20k tackling a range of terrains. When faced with high winds and heavy rain fall the students were met with challenges but consistently demonstrated tenacity and resilience! Students have developed confidence and a range of lifelong skills through their engagement in this programme.

Sixth Form Geography Trip

Our sixth form geographers went in to Nottingham as part of their compulsory fieldwork. Students collected a plethora of data from assessing noise pollution to doing car surveys and assessing the accessibility of Nottingham. Students will now begin to use this data to present it in appropriate ways before going on to analyse their data and draw conclusions.
