Silent Reading	 My teacher may ask me to read silently. My teacher will give me a focus and an end point to read up to. My teacher may give me a task to do alongside the reading. 	 I am silent and respectful to those around me. I read slowly and carefully so that I don't miss anything important from the text. If appropriate, I may use a highlighter or a coloured pen to select key words or features.
Group Reading	 My teacher may ask me to work in a small group with others. My teacher may give us different roles in the group. My teacher will give us a focus and an end point to read up to. 	 I track the text so that I am prepared to read aloud. When it is my turn to read aloud I use a strong voice, but don't drown out those around me as they are also in group reading. I listen carefully when other members of the group are reading.
Teacher Modelling	 My teacher may read aloud to us to show us really effective ways to read the text. My teacher may read from the start of the text so that high expectations are established. 	 I listen carefully to the way my teacher is reading. I might make notes using a highlighter or coloured pen to remind me of key hints and tips. I track the text so that I am prepared to read aloud. When it is my turn to read aloud, I use my teacher's model as a guide.
