Uniform Expectations

We are exceptionally proud to see how the vast majority of our students always come prepared with the right equipment and uniform and we would like to thank you in advance for continuing to support these standards and expectations from the very start of next term.

Therefore, in preparation of a positive start to the new academic year, please see below a polite reminder of some of these expectations. Our full uniform policy is available on our <u>website</u>. Please check the website for more detailed information.

Students must:

- Wear a school tie
- Wear school appropriate black shoes
- Bring a rucksack (handbags are NOT allowed)
- Bring a filled pencil-case with 2 pens, 2 pencils, a ruler, pencil sharpener and rubber.
- Have school appropriate hair styles and colours (please check policy for further details)

Students must **NOT**:

- Wear false eyelashes
- Wear false nails
- Wear excessive make up
- Wear jewellery other than a pair of small stud earrings in the lower lobe of the ear.
- Wear any facial piercings. If a student has a piercing in the nose, they will be expected to remove and wear a small plastic retainer.

Please be advised that, from the start of the new academic year, the behaviour policy will be implemented to address any issues as they arise. These reminders are therefore designed to ensure that all students make a fantastic start to the new term and that learning time is maximised. This then avoids any unnecessary conversations about uniform which take time away from learning.

Results Day

A Level Thursday 15th August

A Level results will be released on Thursday 15th August this year. We will be distributing these results face to face from the school dining hall from 9:00am until 11.00am.

<u>GCSE</u>

GCSE results will be released on Thursday 22nd August this year. We will be distributing these results face to face from 9:00 am until 11:00 am in the school dining hall.

If students are unable to collect the results in person, they may nominate someone else to collect on their behalf but will need to email our Exams Officer, **Mrs Beverley** (<u>kbeverley@newarkacademy.co.uk</u>) with the name of their nominated person.

Changes to lessons next academic year

From September, students will follow a two-week timetable; week A and week B. These will be highlighted on their paper and electronic copies of the timetable to avoid any confusion.

All lessons will increase from 50 minutes to one hour. This change means that we will reduce the number of lessons a day from six lessons to five lessons. There are many advantages to this change. Firstly, it will provide students with more time in lessons to complete independent tasks, which is something student voice feedback has highlighted as a real positive change. Secondly, it means that all students will have fewer lessons in the afternoon, after lunch, which will help maintain higher levels of concentration. Finally, the change will reduce the number of movement times during the school day, and maximise learning opportunities.

September Return

Following three days of staff inset/preparation on Thursday 29th August, Friday 30th August and Monday 2nd September, all students will return to the Academy on Tuesday 3rd September.

On Tuesday 3rd September, all students will go straight to their Crew Leaders classrooms. Once registered, they will spend the remainder of Period 1 completing a number of key induction activities so they are well prepared to start subject lessons from Period 2.

Parents/Carers will receive the necessary Crew Leader and room information for their children via email nearer the time. A reminder that our Academy day commences at 8.25am and all students must be through the bottom pedestrian gate before this time.

Our new Year 7 children will be required to bring a packed lunch with them for their first week with us, whilst we set-up their cashless Squid accounts. Please note, those children who are eligible for free school meals will have these provided from the first day so will not be required to bring a packed lunch with them.

Finally, I would like to make parents aware that parking is limited on site. Please arrange to pick up your child offsite.
