Dear Parents/Carers,

Last Thursday, the Department for Education released the 2024 GCSE outcomes measures. This information is presented as a number called Progress 8, which measures the progress of students across their best eight subjects. The P8 figure allows schools to then compare their students' results to the achievements of students in other schools with the same prior attainment. The average national figure is 0.

Our provisional P8 figure for 2024 GCSE results is +0.40. This means that, on average, Newark Academy students achieve **a third of a grade higher** than students in other schools with similar Key Stage 2 scores. Furthermore, we are extremely proud to share that our P8 figure (+0.40) places **Newark Academy as the highest achieving school in Newark and 5th in a ranking of 79 Nottinghamshire schools.** You can find more information about the performance of schools, either locally or nationally, via the following website link: https://www.compare-school-performance.service.gov.uk/school/144489/the-newark-academy

These GREAT results do not happen by accident. They are the result of hard work over time. What makes Newark Academy such an amazing school is the relentless determination of the whole school community to ensure our learners succeed. I am therefore delighted that the hard work of our staff and students has been reflected and rewarded by these results. Of course, none of this would be possible without parents and carers, who have supported us over the last five years in shaping the academic and personal experiences of our students.

In addition to this excellent news about our GCSE results, this week we have enjoyed rewarding our students for excellent attendance, behaviour and attitude to learning. I have sent 532 emails to the students with 100% attendance and 483 emails to the parents/carers of students with zero negative behaviour points.

One of the many strengths of our school is our sixth form, and our older students always act as excellent role models for the younger students. This week, they have excelled themselves in the way they have led our 'Receiving and Giving' week, raising money for charity by organising a number of events for everyone to enjoy and take part in. As a school community we have raised over \pounds 400 this week.
