- Please note, if no information is provided, a **first day absence message** will automatically be sent out from school to the Priority 1 contact.
- Contact from home to the school should be made **each day your child is absent** from school. **Safe and well checks** will be carried out when these absences are for extended periods of time.

Please may we remind parents and carers that for all medical appointments during school time we require evidence in the form of an appointment card, confirmation letter or a screenshot of a text message received. Without evidence we are unable to authorise the absence.

During the session, students explored the technique of free writing, discussing its advantages and disadvantages. They also gained a valuable insight into the demands of academic writing. The information shared in the session will benefit our students tremendously in their academic writing, both now and in the future. It holds particular importance for those student studying subjects with a coursework/NEA element to them.








Full Crew/Assemblies
