KS4 and KS5 assemblies were delivered by Alonzo, from ASK Apprenticeships, who
explained the fundamental elements of an apprenticeship, where to look for these
opportunities and how to then apply.







- The Year 9 assembly was delivered by Emma Stevens, from Nottingham College. Emma spoke to the students about the range of post 16 options that will be available them. This information will support our students with their GCSE option choices later this term.
- Year 8 heard from Joe Hunt, from Active4Today, about the range of roles they offer, including apprenticeships. His talk featured a video from another Alumni student, Luke Dixon. Luke is thoroughly enjoying his apprenticeship and we are incredibly proud of everything that Luke and Naomi have achieved!
- Year 7 students listened to a presentation from an Alumni student and previous Head Girl, Naomi Tivey. Naomi secured an apprenticeship with Newark & Sherwood District Council in HR and is now a full-time employee of NSDC. The students were fascinated by Naomi's journey.
