Teaching and Learning is the core business of any school and at Newark Academy we are very lucky to have such talented and committed staff who are always keen to enhance the learning experience of our young people even further. This academic year we will focus on developing classroom talk as a vehicle for students to deepen their knowledge and understanding as well as developing confidence in public speaking. Therefore, over the next few weeks, as part of the Crew programme and assemblies, we will deliver sessions to our students on the importance of oracy, high level vocabulary and active listening so they feel well prepared to engage in structured classroom talk in lessons.
