# Attendance and reporting absence

Thank you to all parents for ensuring that our students attend school every day ready to learn. We are delighted with our attendance so far this year which shows how committed we all are to the education of our young people. We have been particularly pleased with the attendance of our Year 11 students who, since returning from the summer holidays, have displayed real resilience and are working extremely hard work in all their lessons. When students attend school, and also commit to independent revision at home, they place themselves in a great position, well prepared to tackle their exams. We will embark on the first round of Y11 mock exams on Friday 8th November and, in preparation for these, we are hosting a Year 11 Success Evening on 30th September. On this evening, we will be sharing with our Year 11 parents and students a range of the most effective revision strategies.

## **Student Leadership**

This week has been a showcase of the leadership potential of our Year 7 and Year 12 students. Year 7 students have actively participated in the election process for their new Crew Representative, and I must say I have been blown away by their speeches. They have demonstrated their commitment and enthusiasm to represent their peers and lead their crews. Additionally, sixth form students have submitted written applications for the role of Vice Ambassador. They have highlighted the personal strengths and attributes they possess that make them strong candidates for this role which enables them to make a positive and impactful contribution to their school community. As in previous years, Year 12 students have designed creative election campaigns, producing promotional videos to secure votes. These videos have allowed them to showcase their leadership skills, vision and aspirations for our school. All videos will be watched next week and a whole school voting process will then take place.

### Reading
