Dear Parents/Carers

I hope my email finds you and your families well.

One of the many strengths of Newark Academy is how inclusive we are and we are incredibly proud of meeting the needs of all our learners. In our Full Crew/assemblies this week we have celebrated neurodiversity week. Mrs Kent has explained how our brains are all unique and work in different ways. Students have watched short videos on autism, ADHD and dyslexia which describe what it is like to have a neurodiversity and outline the strategies individuals use to support them each day. Our students have engaged very positively with this important theme; they displayed interest, empathy and an understanding of the importance of celebrating our differences.

Therefore, as a school and as a Trust, we are challenging sQuid's decision. We would ask parents, where possible, to hold off withdrawing funds until we have had a response from sQuid. Please be aware that regardless of the outcome of this challenge, we are committed to ensuring that no parent is out of pocket due to this charge.

Finally, we have received an extraordinary amount of very positive feedback from employers who have supported our Year 10 work experience placements this week. The students have performed exceptionally well in a broad range of job roles and businesses. Some students had a firm idea of where they wanted to work and secured an experience linked to their future plans; others have found the experience a useful introduction to the world of work as they decide what they want to do. Their 'employers' ranged from opticians to nurseries, car dealers to hairdressers. Some students visited their own former primary schools for the week. Others were placed in solicitors, shops and some even joined the site team at Newark Academy.

Work Experience is an important milestone in preparing students for life beyond school. We would like to thank our Careers Lead, Mrs Brown, as well as all the employers for supporting our students and providing such worthwhile experiences. Our young people have appreciated it greatly!
