Dear Parents/Carers,

I hope my email finds you and your families well.

Thank you so much to our Year 12 and 13 parents for their attendance at their Achievement Evening last night. It is so encouraging to see how invested parents are in the education of our students and the choices they now face. Please do not underestimate the importance of us working together – home and school – for the benefit of our young people. We all believe in the potential of every student and know that your ongoing support together with the hard work of the fantastic staff at Newark Academy will ensure they fulfil this potential.

This week, our Full Crew/assemblies have focused on the importance of British Values and the dangers of radicalisation. Miss Dilks has spoken to students about how the five British Values are applicable in our school community and create a safe and purposeful environment rooted in mutual respect and tolerance.

In the assembly, students also explored the meaning of radicalisation and, more importantly, were given guidance on how to spot the signs and where to seek support if needed. Miss Dilks also explained the prevalence of fake news and how misinformation and disinformation can contribute to the development of these beliefs and opinions. As always, students engaged very well, listened attentively and asked very pertinent and insightful questions.

Newark Academy is committed to providing all students with opportunities that enhance their classroom experience. Two of the highlights of the week for me have been the enrichment activities that some of our Year 8s and Year 9s have participated in.

30 Year 8 students enjoyed a workshop with 'Extreme Wheels'; this focused on teamwork, resilience and understanding of how to make positive choices in the community to keep themselves safe.

Yesterday a group of Year 9 girls with an interest and talent in STEM subjects took part in the 'Girls Believe' Project. This session was extremely engaging and was delivered by engineers from Equans Energy. Our students absolutely loved it and many of them are now considering careers in STEM. They are very much looking forward to the final part of the project to visit the Equans site in **London on 23**rd **June**.


